DETROIT RESCUE MISSION MINISTRIES - EMERGENCY SHELTER

Provides an emergency shelter for men. Support services include meals, the opportunity to shower and receive new clothing items, pastoral counseling and referrals to substance abuse treatment, employment and various other services. Shelter counselors do an assessment with each resident, encourage and help residents to apply for services and take steps to help them meet long term needs including job search/placement assistance and assure that clients receive emergency medical or counseling needs.

REQUIREMENTS

ELIGIBILITY: Homeless men age 18 and older with no children

APPLICATION PROCESS: - For intake walk-in to one of CAM's Access Points: - Young men 18-24 years old: 1600 Porter Detroit, 48216 (Mon-Fri 11am-7pm) - Single adults & young men 18-24 years old: 3430 Third Ave. Detroit, 48201 (Mon-Fri 11am-7pm) or 23 E. Adams (Mon-Thu 10am-4pm) - Veterans: 310 Piquette (Sun-Mon 8am-8pm) - Call CAM at 313-305-0311 for more information - Outside of CAM's operating hours, clients may call shelter directly for placement. However, an assessment must be completed the following business day at one of the Access Points

REQUIRED DOCUMENTS: May be asked to show government issued photo identification

SERVICE HOURS: Program runs from 3:30pm-7:30am daily

SALVATION ARMY (THE) - BOOTH SERVICES

Provides emergency shelter for women with children. Guests are not required to leave during the day. Support services include meals, clothing, medical care, individual counseling, housing placement assistance, and parenting skills and nutrition classes. Maximum length of stay is 90 days.

REQUIREMENTS

ELIGIBILITY: Residents must be able and willing to seek stable housing and employment. May be required to apply for assistance through the Michigan Department of Health and Human Services.

APPLICATION PROCESS: Call for more information on bed availability

REQUIRED DOCUMENTS: - Government issued photo identification - May be required to provide birth certificates or Social Security cards for all family members - Some programs will require proof of previous residency

AREA SERVED: Wayne County

SERVICE HOURS: Must call between 7am-3pm in order to request shelter for that night

Shelter counselors do an assessment with each resident, encourage and help residents apply for services and take steps to help them meet long term needs, and assure that clients receive emergency medical or counseling needs.

REQUIREMENTS

ELIGIBILITY: Women ages 18 and older that are single or with children

REQUIRED DOCUMENTS: May be asked to provide state issued identification

YWCA OF METROPOLITAN DETROIT - YWCA INTERIM HOUSE

Provides shelter to women survivors of domestic violence/sexual assault and their children. Services include a 67 bed shelter, 24 hour crisis line, individual and group counseling, support groups, legal advocacy, sexual assault advocacy, child care services, volunteer training, non-residential programs and support groups, community education and referrals for housing, legal services, medical assistance, transportation and financial assistance.

REQUIREMENTS

ELIGIBILITY: Women age 18 and older who have been physically, emotionally or sexually assaulted and their minor children

FIRST STEP: WESTERN AND DOWNRIVER WAYNE COUNTY PROJECT ON DOMESTIC AND SEXUAL VIOLENCE - WAYNE OFFICE

Provides emergency, short term shelter for victims of domestic and/or sexual violence and their children. Shelter services include individual and group counseling, safety planning, medical attention, housing referrals, and educational and recreational activities for children. Shelter location is confidential.

REQUIREMENTS

ELIGIBILITY: - Adult victims (male and female) of sexual assault or domestic violence and their minor children - No restriction on age or number of children - Serves Wayne County primarily, but accepts victims of other areas if needed and beds are available

APPLICATION PROCESS: Call to check bed availability and get shelter location

REQUIRED DOCUMENTS: Requests government issued photo identification, if available

SERVICE HOURS: Mon-Sun 24 hours
